#### 1. Approval of Minutes

Alderman Petersen moved to approve the May 12, 2015 Work Session and May 12, 2015 Board of Mayor and Aldermen minutes as presented. Seconded by Vice Mayor Barnhill. Motion carried unanimously 7-0.

# 2. CONSENT AGENDA

All items under the Consent Agenda are deemed non-controversial and routine in nature by the governing body. They will be approved as recommended by Committee or staff by one motion of the governing body. The items on the Consent Agenda will not be discussed. Any member of the governing body desiring to discuss an item on the Consent Agenda may request that it be removed from the Consent Agenda and be placed on the Regular Agenda. It will then be considered at that time. Staff recommends that Item Numbers 10-17 be placed on the Consent Agenda. Alderman Bransford moved to approve the Consent Agenda Items 10-16, Item 17 was pulled by Alderman Burger. Seconded by Alderman Burger. Motion carried unanimously 7-0.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

3. PUBLIC HEARING: Consideration of ORDINANCE 2014-50, "An Ordinance to Amend Title 23 of the City of Franklin Municipal Code to change Ordinance Trigger Thresholds, Remove Buffers on Channels That Serve 25 Acres of Tributary Area, Revise Definitions, Clarify Requirements and to Correct Grammatical and Typographical Errors."

[Second and Final Reading]

Public Hearing:

David Parker explained that when this was discussed at the Work Session, Alderman Petersen asked if language in the ordinance addressed critical lots. He had answered that it was included. Subsequently, he discovered the language had been removed. This amendment restores the language. He asked that the motion reflect the wording in the amendment.

With no one else coming forth to speak, Mayor Moore declared the Public Hearing Closed

Alderman Skinner moved to approve Ordinance 2014-50 with the following amendment: "Add to Section 23-102. Jurisdiction; Subsection (2)(c) Lots classified as Critical Lots as defined in the City's Zoning Ordinance and Development in Critical Areas are not exempt from the requirements of this article." Seconded by Alderman Bransford.

#### Discussion:

- Alderman Petersen asked Mr. Parker for clarification of several items in the ordinance.
- Alderman Burger had questions as well. In particular, the determination of a wet weather conveyance.
- Mr. Parker advised City Stormwater Inspectors are qualified to make that determination according to criteria provided.

Motion to approve Ordinance 2014-50 with amendment as stated carried unanimously 7-0 on Second and Final Reading.

4. PUBLIC HEARING: Consideration of ORDINANCE 2014-28, Amending Table 3-2; Permitted Uses and Chapter 8 Definitions, to Allow Short-Term Vacation Rentals in Various Zoning Districts.

Public Hearing:

With no one coming forth to speak, Mayor Moore declared the Public Hearing Closed

Alderman Martin moved to approve Ordinance 2014-28. Seconded by Alderman Blanton.

#### Discussion:

- Eric Stuckey noted Short-Term Vacation Rentals are allowed in the same zoning districts as a Bed and Breakfast. The ordinance now authorizes this use.
- Alderman Burger asked for clarification of the number of days stay that are considered short-term.
- Chris Bridgewater responded that a stay of 21 days or less is regulated by this ordinance. Anything over 21 days is considered to be a rental and not regulated by this ordinance.
- Alderman Burger had previously asked that fire extinguishers be added to the list of requirements and that isn't on the list. She asked that staff tell applicants that fire extinguishers are recommended.

Motion to approve Ordinance 2014-28 carried unanimously 7-0 on Second of Three Readings.

5. Consideration of ORDINANCE 2015-06, An Ordinance to Create Title 13, Chapter 2 of the Franklin Municipal Code Establishing Regulations for Short Term Vacation Rentals.

[Second and Final Reading]

Eric Stuckey requested this item be deferred to June 9 to coincide with final approval of Ordinance 2014-28.

Alderman Burger moved to defer Ordinance 2015-06 to June 9, 2015. Seconded by Vice Mayor Barnhill. Motion carried unanimously 7-0.

6. Consideration of ORDINANCE 2015-02, An Ordinance to Amend Title 12, Chapter 10 of the Franklin Municipal Code Amending the International Residential Code, 2012 Edition, Requiring Fire Sprinklers in Some Townhomes.

[Second and Final Reading]

Eric Stuckey requested this item be withdrawn. Changes were made at State level and sprinklers are not required.

Alderman Burger moved to withdraw Ordinance 2015-02. Seconded by Alderman Bransford. Motion to withdraw carried unanimously 7-0.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

7. Consideration of ORDINANCE 2015-15, An Ordinance to Amend THE Fiscal Year 2014-2015 Budget; Establishing a Public Hearing date of June 9, 2015.

Alderman Blanton moved to approve Ordinance 2015-15. Seconded by Vice Mayor Barnhill.

Eric Stuckey said there is potential to make transfers from the General Fund on several items to keep the funds at the appropriate reserve levels at the end of this fiscal year and the beginning of the new fiscal year. This is per the State Comptroller and for the worst case scenario.

Motion to approve Ordinance 2015-15 carried unanimously on First of Two Readings.

8. Consideration of ORDINANCE 2015-13, An Ordinance of the City of Franklin, TN, Adopting a Budget for the Fiscal Year 2015-2016, and Providing an Effective Date; Establishing a Public Hearing Date of June 9, 2015.

[First of Three Readings]

Alderman Bransford moved to approve Ordinance 2015-13. Seconded by Vice Mayor Barnhill.

Eric Stuckey highlighted:

- Total of all funds \$122.9 million an approximate 3% increase over the current year.
- General Fund budget \$59.8 million, a 6% increase over the current year.
- It is a return to the budget the City had in 2008-2009.
- The budget is balanced with current revenues equaling expenditures.
- In compliance with BOMA's debt and reserve policies.
- Fire Station No. 8 (Westhaven) will open in 2015.
- A general salary increase of 2.0% proposed for July 3, 2015 plus a fourth year of merit pay program
- Base Property Tax same as 2015 (.4065 per \$100 of assessed valuation).
- · No increase in sanitation fee.

Motion to approve Ordinance 2015-13 carried unanimously (7-0) on First of Three Readings.

9. Consideration of ORDINANCE 2015-14, An Ordinance of the City of Franklin, TN, Establishing the Municipal Property Tax Levy for the Fiscal Year 2015-2016, and Providing an Effective Date; Establishing a Public Hearing Date of June 9, 2015.

Vice Mayor Barnhill moved to approve Ordinance 2015-14. Seconded by Alderman Petersen. Motion carried unanimously (7-0) on First of Three Readings.
