Public Hearing

Brad Wilson, 414 Crosscreek Court; expressed concern of child and pedestrian safety with regards to the road.

Brian Caplen, 1991 Beacon Hill; stated concerns regarding citizen safety at road entrances and exits, and the 'blind' hill.

Marie Ferguson, 1112 Ridgeway Drive of Franklin East; stated concerns of new City road being built to standards and if it would be designed for additional traffic. Questioned how the current county road would join to the proposed city road. Concerned for the safety of the approximately 25 children who reside on the main road.

Ted Buselmeir, 1109 Ridgeway Drive. Invites board members to drive on the narrow, curvy road. Believes the City would be putting a large numbers of cars on roads not intended for this traffic if the development were approved.

Larry Cox, 220 Vantage Way in Crosscreek subdivision; Concerns are traffic, safety, and children; stated these residents will not get city services, but will experience traffic and safety concerns.

Troy Mizell, 4113 Murfreesboro Road; Sees the Ashcroft plan holding up his request for deannexation.

With no further public comments, Mayor Ken Moore declared the Public Hearing closed.

Alderman Skinner moved to approve the Initiation of the Annexation Process and Plan of Services For the Annexation of Certain Areas on South Carothers Road, Specifically 4350 and 4344 South Carothers Road. Seconded by Alderman Barnhill.

Ald Skinner stated that the information provided to the Board is vague. He would like to see the proposed plan of services and development before a final vote.

Alderman Martin stated she would not support the further conditions for annexation. Has concerns regarding the traffic that would travel through the county subdivision.

Ann Petersen stated she would not support the annexation for many of the reasons that Alderman Martin mentioned, as well as the idea of trying to get to a subdivision using a residential collector or a part of Carothers Road.

Alderman Bransford stated she will not support this for the same reason other developments have been turned down – the road accommodations are not adequate.

Alderman Barnhill clarified that this item initiates the study for annexation, it does not state that we will annex this item. It does include the Plan of Services; stated he believes it's premature to reject the plan and would like to see what other items come from the traffic and infrastructure studies.

Alderman Burger expressed she does not like this project, but supports the process. Believes the Board needs to do their jobs in the best way they can by having all facts. Asked to hear from the representative of the development.

Greg Gamble representing the developers of Ashcroft Valley addressed the Board. He understands the importance of connectivity and has asked the developer's traffic engineer to start the process to analyze the roads within this area. Plans to work with the City and the third party engineer on this traffic study. Gave an example of Simmons Ridge development and Carothers's Road. The developer anticipates traffic improvements, and would like another work shop meeting and neighborhood meeting regarding the new plan being proposed. Greg expressed that they are taking into consideration the concerns from adjacent neighbors; needs approval on this item to move to next step.

Alderman McLendon agrees that to contemplate this annexation, more information is needed; feels the problem with this request is that it is too small. He said he cannot support this small annexation when knows there is more coming; does not want to do a disservice to the current residents. He has an objection to annexing this if this is a small piece of a larger puzzle; would rather contemplate the larger picture. Cannot support this, but might support a larger piece of annexation.

Vice Mayor Blanton expressed that she understands the resident's concern of safety and does not support this item. Alderman Burger stated that she has a problem with shutting down the process. Also has a problem with holding up a (deannexation) decision for Mr. Mizell's property.

Eric Stuckey clarified that the State law regarding annexation has been modified in the last few years and it now allows annexation to occur either through adjoining property owners submitting an application to annex into a community, or through a referendum of (multiple) property owners. A city can no longer just annex a section by action or by ordinance; it must be driven by the property owner or direct application. He also reiterated this is just a request for initiation of the annexation process.

A vote was taken and the motion to approve failed 5-3. Those members voting to deny the initiation of annexation were Vice Mayor Blanton, Alderman McLendon, Alderman Martin, Alderman Petersen, and Alderman Bransford. Those members voting for the initiation of annexation were Alderman Skinner, Alderman Burger, and Alderman Barnhill.
