## **RESOLUTION 2014-94**

## A RESOLUTION TO FUND THE FINAL DESIGN OF MCEWEN DRIVE, PHASE IV IMPROVEMENTS (COOL SPRINGS BLVD TO WILSON PIKE)

**WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2014 the Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) approved Resolution 2014-13, a resolution to adopt the funding plan for the FY 2014-2018 CIP (Capital Investment Program); and

**WHEREAS**, the BOMA desire to complete the final design of McEwen Drive, Phase IV Improvements (Cool Springs Blvd to Wilson Pike); and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution 2014-13 included \$340,000 for the McEwen Drive, Phase IV Improvements (Cool Springs Blvd to Wilson Pike), Professional Design Services; and

**WHEREAS**, the CIP sheets provided to the BOMA estimated the final design at approximately Six Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$680,000) (\$340,000 in FY 2015 and \$340,000 in FY 2016); and

**WHEREAS**, Sullivan Engineering, Inc. has provided the City of Franklin with a proposal to complete the design for an amount not to exceed Seven Hundred Thirteen Thousand Dollars (\$713,000); and

**WHEREAS**, the final design for McEwen Drive, Phase IV Improvements (Cool Springs Blvd to Wilson Pike) includes 4~12' travel lanes separated by a 20' median, curb and gutter, storm drainage, street lights, ITS conduit, retaining walls, 12' bike/pedestrian path on the south side and no sidewalk on the north side.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Franklin, Tennessee, that the McEwen Drive, Phase IV Improvements (Cool Springs Blvd to Wilson Pike) project shall be funded for design in the amount of **Seven Hundred**Thirteen Thousand Dollars (\$713,000) and shall include 4~12' travel lanes separated by a 20' median, curb and gutter, storm drainage, street lights, ITS conduit, retaining walls, 12' bike/pedestrian path on the south side and no sidewalk on the north side.
