The City has spent the last year taking the Strategic Plan (**Franklin***Forward*) from concept to practice. We have:

refocused and reformatted all budgets around

- Used **Franklin***Forward* to drive how the City measures its data and performance.



Transitioning Data: Next Step

We are now ready to take the next step: to present that data in an easily accessible format to our citizens and taxpayers. To do this, we recommend partnering with Socrata to develop an open government platform which can be accessed 24/7/365.



Socrata: What is it?



Socrata, Inc. is a Seattle-based software-as-aservice provider with a global presence founded in 2007. It is a global leader in government data and performance management which focuses exclusively on a cloud-based platform that democratizes access to government data in order to:

Transform government - Improve resident engagement - Increase transparency - Fuel innovation - Make data-driven decisions - Improve operational efficiency

Theme: A Safe, Clean and Livable City


Sub-Theme: Franklin will have safe neighborhoods supported by high-quality police, fire, and emergency services as well as effective code enforcement.

Goal: Maintain violent crime rate in Franklin at least half of the national average and decrease by 3% annually. (# per 100,000 pop.)

With Socrata, we can visualize these themes and goals and create an interactive dashboard. Below is the City of Kansas City's Online Data Site:



Both Franklin and Kansas City share the goal of Crime Reduction. Clicking on the link Crime Reduction opens:






Crimes Against Property

Crimes against property include those where the primary objective of the crime is to obtain money, property or se


Crimes Against Property By Type

Crimes against property are each associated with a particular NIBRS code (described above), which is shown on the side of the chart below. The legend provides the description of each code. The chart below shows counts for calendar year 2014 year-to-date. (data updated weekly)
