

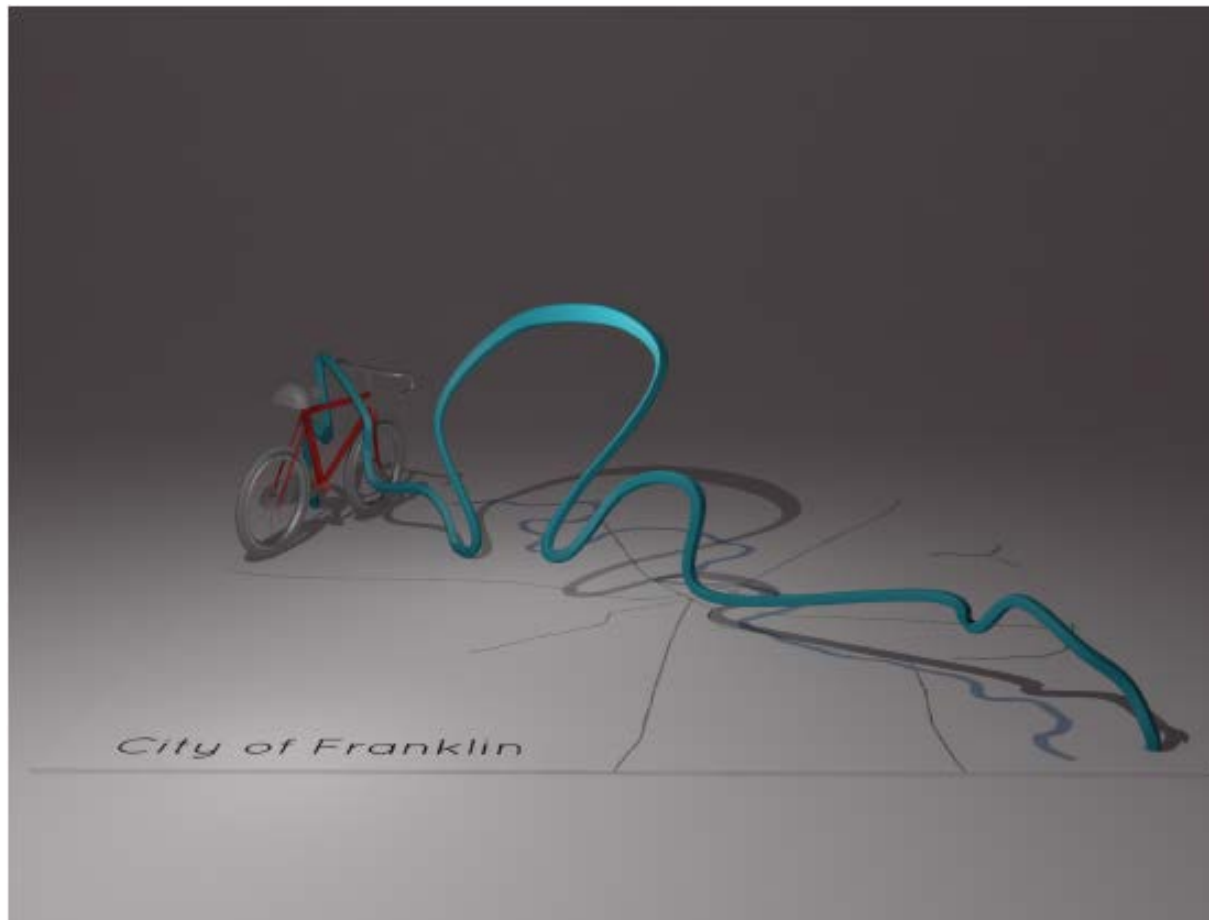
# Public Art Bike Rack

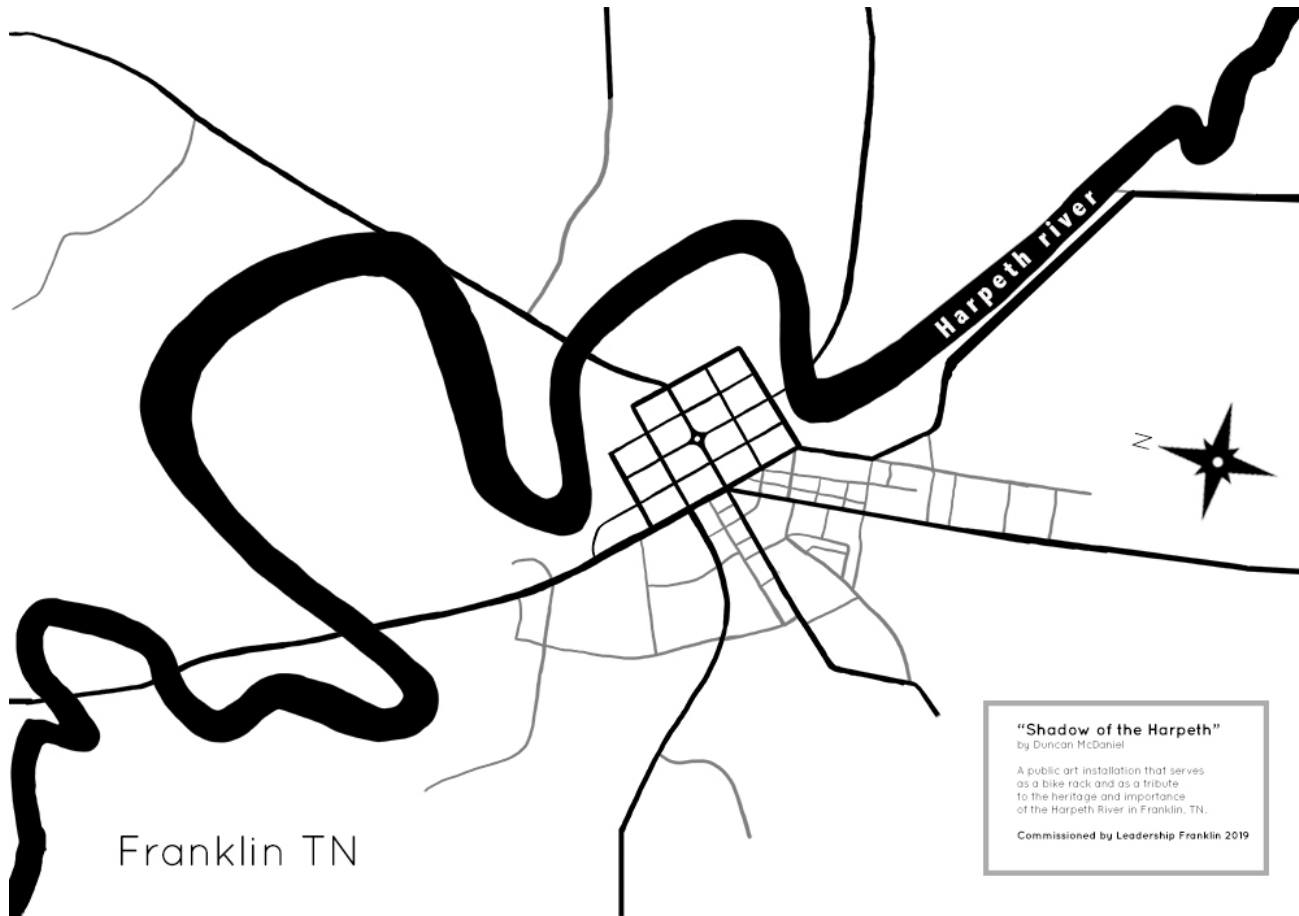

# Cement Inlay

The bike rack will sit over a cement inlay map of the City of Franklin which will showcase the Harpeth River as it runs through Franklin offering perspective to its viewers.

# Usability & Durability

The bike rack has been thoughtfully created to accommodate multiple bikes as you can see from the renderings below.

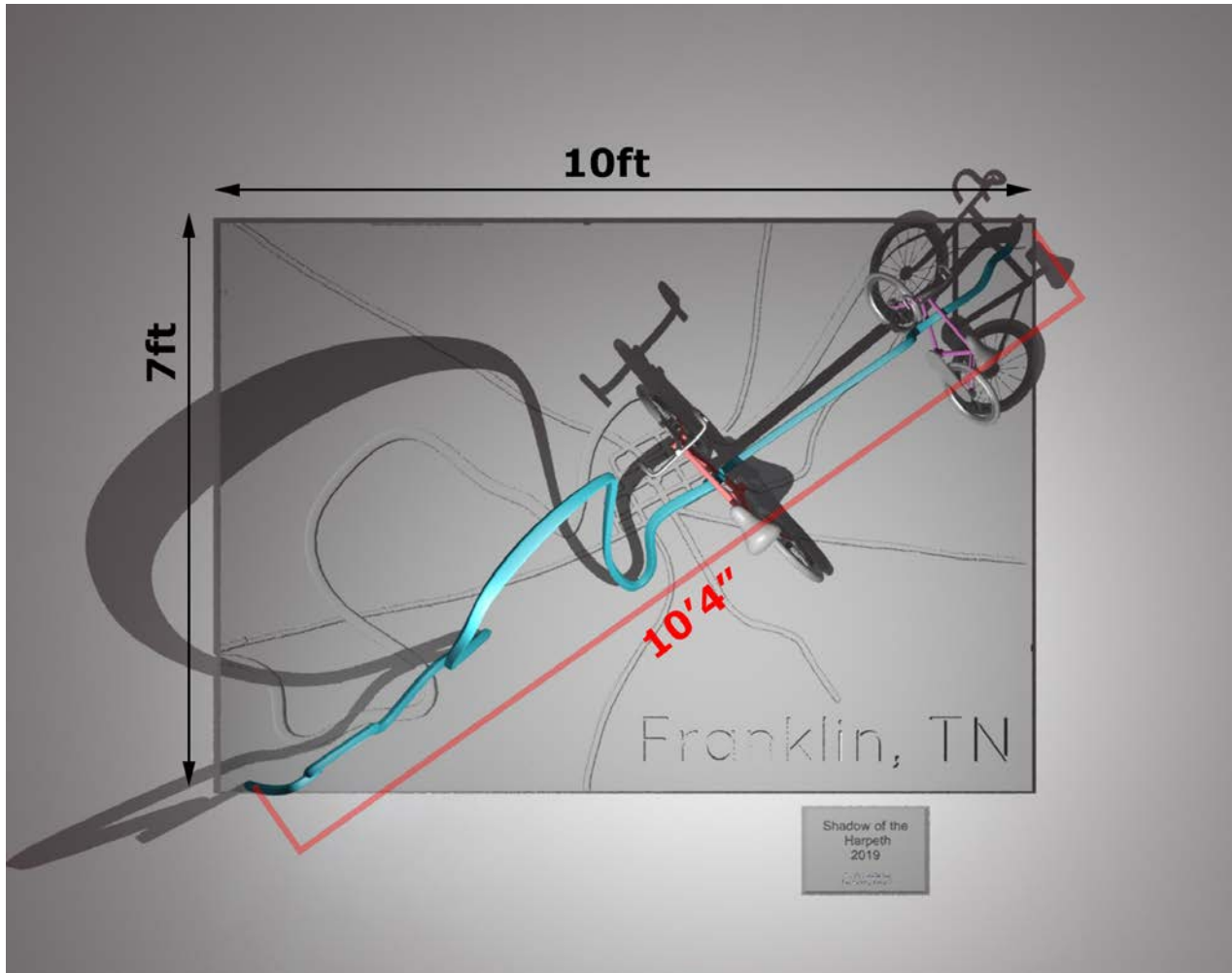
It will be made of steel and colored with powder coated paint, materials that will last indefinitely.



# Scale of Bike Rack

The cement inlay will be 7ft in length and 10ft in width.  
The bike rack will be 10ft 4in in length.

*\*Note that the plaque will be placed inside the cement inlay.*

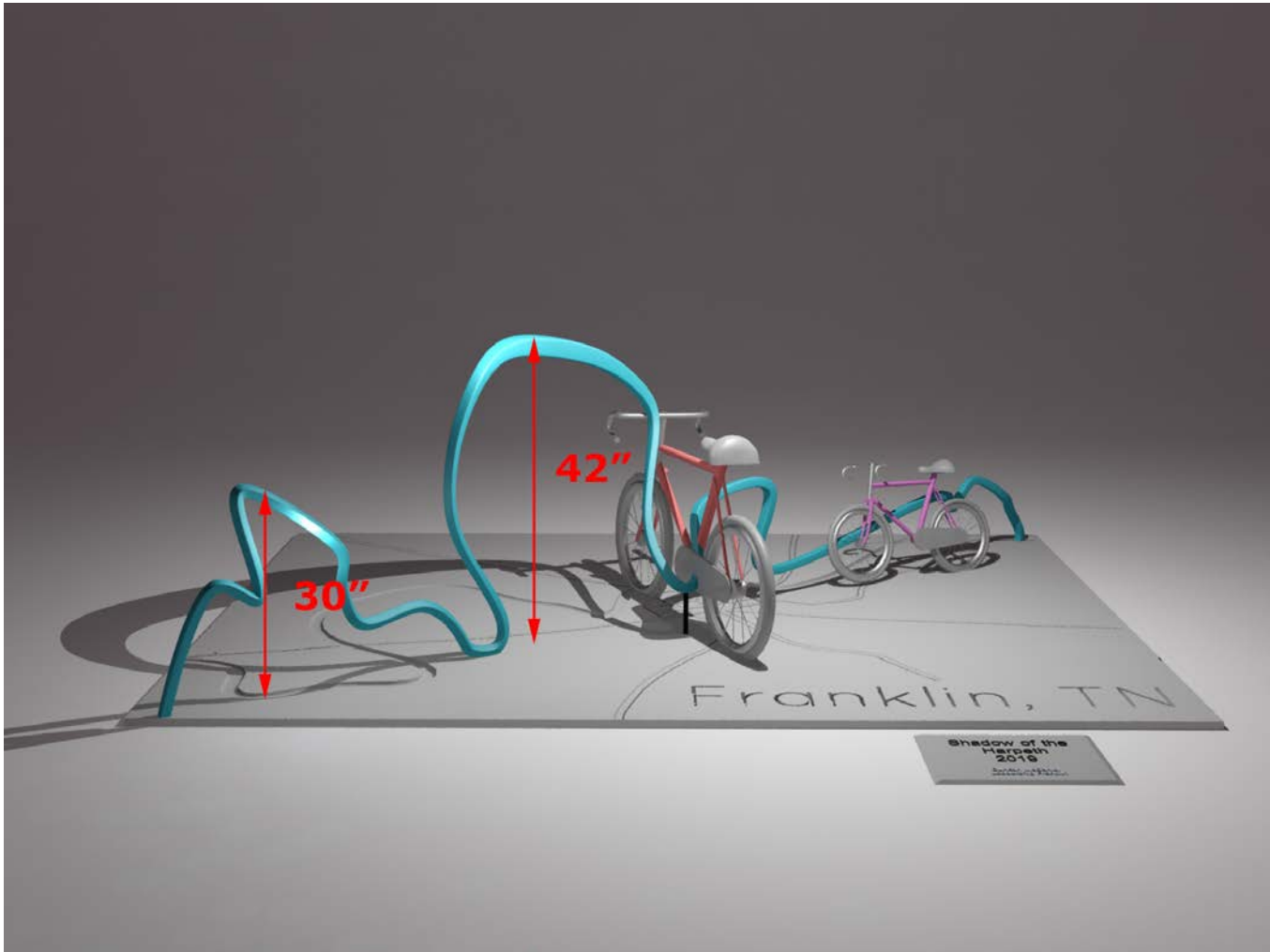




# Scale of Bike Rack

At it's tallest point the bike rack will measure 42in in height.

*\*Again, please note that the plaque will be placed inside the cement inlay.*
