## **RESOLUTION NO. 2015-07**

## A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE THE VARIOUS ASPECTS OF THE TEMPORARY FIRE STATION #7 PROJECT WITHIN A PROJECT BUDGET OF \$150,000

**WHEREAS**, on the morning of Friday, August 15, 2014, a tragic accident occurred on Interstate 65 at exit 61 (Peytonsville Road), requiring removal and reconstruction of the Peytonsville Road bridge; and

**WHEREAS,** certain City residents were made subject to a much greater risk due to increased response times from emergency personnel resulting from the closed major thoroughfare; and

WHEREAS, realizing the added risk created to some of our residents, the City began immediate discussions with Williamson County ("County") about medical, law enforcement and fire protection needs for the affected area, and the County offered temporary free space at the Williamson County Ag Expo Center for Franklin Fire operations; and

**WHEREAS**, although the Peytonsville Road bridge is now open, this area remains vulnerable to future events until additional access can be completed, making it prudent for the City to continue providing services through a continued Temporary Fire Station #7; and

**WHEREAS,** the County has agreed to allow the City to use a different portion of the improved property located at 4215 Long Lane, Franklin, Tennessee to construct a pole barn and temporary housing unit for a Temporary Fire Station #7; and

WHEREAS, the City anticipates that to construct Temporary Fire Station #7 will require a project budget of approximately One Hundred Fifty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$150,000.00), funded through the City's Facilities Tax Fund; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Mayor and Aldermen believe it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Franklin to grant authority to the City Administrator to execute various aspects of this project within the project budget so that the project may proceed efficiently.

## NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, TENNESSEE THAT:

The City Administrator shall be authorized to enter into agreements and authorize purchases on behalf of the City of Franklin for the process of the construction of the Temporary Fire Station #7 project, so long as such agreements and purchases remain within the project budget of One Hundred Fifty Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$150,000.00). The City Administrator will report to the Board on a monthly basis any agreements entered into or purchases made on behalf of the City for this project.
