

RESOLUTION 2015-111

TO BE ENTITLED: A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT A POLICY TO LIMIT VOLUME OF CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS ACCEPTED AT THE CITY-OWNED TRANSFER STATION

WHEREAS, for the purpose of promoting the public health, safety, comfort, convenience, and general welfare of the people of Franklin, Tennessee the Board of Mayor and Aldermen for the City of Franklin, Tennessee is authorized to prescribe policies that encourage and advance the quality of life within the City; and

WHEREAS, in its legislative judgment, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen has found that resolutions and policies that guide the maintenance of the City's infrastructure, and delivery of essential services must be dynamic and modified from time to time to reflect changes in best practices, model codes, labor costs, and safety standards necessary to preserve and promote the private and public interest; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen have, on behalf of the citizens of Franklin, invested in a Transfer Station located at 411 Century Court; and

WHEREAS, the facility is used by the City of Franklin for solid waste transportation of waste collected by the City and private hauling companies; and

WHEREAS, the City's volume, in tons, delivered to the City transfer station exceeds any previous volume accepted at the City Transfer Station; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Franklin, Tennessee find that it is in the best interests of the City to grant authority to the City Administrator and Director of Sanitation and Environmental Services, to limit the volume of construction and demolition debris accepted at the City-owned transfer station, based on the volume of solid wastes received for processing and the balance needed for operational efficiencies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, TENNESSEE THAT:

Section 1. The City Administrator and Director of Sanitation and Environmental Services are hereby authorized to limit the volume of construction and demolition debris accepted at the City-owned transfer station, located at 411 Century Court, Franklin, Tennessee.
