TRAINING POLICY:

All beer applications must have a training policy submitted with application. This policy must include training regarding the sale of beer to minors.

- 19. Please read the following and upon signature of this application, you do understand and agree to comply if you are granted a permit.
 - (a) You will not sell beer or similar beverages except at the place or places for which the beer board has issued your permit.
 - (b) You will not sell beer or any like beverage except in accordance with the terms of said permit.
 - (c) If this application is made for permit to sell and not for consumption on the premises, you will not sell for consumption on the premises and not allow consumption on the premises.
 - (d) You will rigidly enforce the law against sales to minors.
 - (e) You will prohibit gambling at your establishment and understand that the conduct of such activities on the premises will result in revocation of your permit.
 - (f) You will secure a certificate or statement from the health department or health officer that the premises covered by the application meet the requirements of the ordinances of the City of Franklin and the laws of the State of Tennessee.
 - (g) You will not attempt to transfer this permit to anyone else.
 - (h) You will display this permit in a prominent place in your establishment.
 - (i) You will not sell or distribute beer between the hours of 3:00 AM and 6:00 AM (8:00 AM for on premises consumption) during the week and between the hours of 3:00 AM Sunday and 12:00 Noon Sunday (10:00 AM for on premises consumption).
 - (j) You will prohibit the congregation at your establishment of those who reasonably appear to be intoxicated, lawless, rowdy, or prostitutes.
 - (k) You will not allow any liquor with alcoholic content of greater than five percent (5%) to be consumed on the premises.

- (I) You will not allow any sale or delivery of beer for consumption on the premises outside of the building, it being the intention to prohibit the sale of beer by what is commonly known as "curb service" or "curb sales" of beer.
- (m) You will comply with all requirements of section 2-201 through 2-229 of the municipal code of the City of Franklin.

A non-refundable \$250 fee must accompany this application and the application shall be submitted at least fifteen (15) days prior to the Beer Board meeting at which it is to be considered. If the application is approved you are required to provide documentation of sales tax registration to the city within ten days of approval. Any applicant making false statement in this application shall forfeit his permit and shall not be eligible to receive any permit for a period of ten years.

A privilege tax of \$100 is imposed on the business of selling, distributing, storing or manufacturing beer in this state effective January 1, 1994 and each successive January 1. Any holder of a beer permit issued after January 1, 1994 shall pay a pro rata portion of this annual tax when the permit is issued.

I hereby make application to the City of Franklin Beer Board for a beer permit.

The signing of this application acknowledges that I am aware of the laws prohibiting the sale of beer to minors.

I hereby certify that no person having at least a 5% ownership interest, nor any person to be employed in the distribution or sale of beer in my establishment has been convicted of any violation of the beer or alcoholic beverage laws or any crime involving moral turpitude within the past 10 years.

I am also aware that I shall not be issued a permit or my permit shall be revoked if my business location causes traffic congestion or interferes with schools, churches, or other public places of public gathering, or otherwise interferes with public health, safety and morals.





Legislative intent

It is the intent of the legislature through the provisions of the TN Responsible Alcohol Vendor Act.

- To eliminate the sale of beer for off-the-premises consumption to, and consumption of beer by, underage persons;
- 2. To reduce intoxication and to reduce accidents, injuries, and deaths in the state that are related to intoxication:
- 3. To encourage vencors to be prudent in their selling practices of deer, and to restrict or reduce the sanctions that may be imposed in administrative proceedings by local beer boards against those vendors who voluntarily comply with responsible practices in accordance with this part; and
- 4. To uniformly apply all provisions in this part statewide, including training, certification and the imposition of penalties or other sanctions for violations of this part, and that no variations from the provisions on training, certification or penalties are permissible.






Visible Signs of Intoxication

The following is a list of signs to look for when trying to identify an intoxicated customer

- * Red or blood shot eyes
- Staggering
- * Strong alcohol breath
- Difficulty in handling money
- Slurred speech
- Animated behavior
- Loud and boisterous behavior





Selling Alcohol to Intoxicated Individuals

Do not sell or furnish beer to any person who appears, considering the totality of the circumstances, to be intoxicated. The penalty can involve up to eleven months and 29 cays of probation and a \$2500 fine.


21 for Everyone!

- A person less than 21 years of age may not purchase, consume, possess or transport any alcohol, liquor or malt or brewed beverages within the State of Tennessee.
- It is illegal to seli, deliver, furnish or give away arcoholic beverages to any
 minor, or to permit any minor to drink or consume any alcoholic beverages on
 the licensed premises.




Consequences


Setting, oelivering, furnishing or giving away alcoholic beverages to any minor is a class A misdemeanor and can carry a fine of \$2500 as well as eleven months and twenty nine days on probation for anyone convicted of this offence.





- It is illegal for a minor to attempt to purchase, consume, possess or to transport any alcoholic beverages within the state. It is illegal for any minor to faisely represent that they are of legal drinking age.
- It is also inegal for anyone to falsely represent that a minor is of legal crinking age in order to buy alcoholic beverages.





















A potential underage purchaser can usually count on the fact that any borrowed ID will not be closely inspected by the alcohol server.

How can you detect a fake or altered ID?

Remember:

ALWAYS have the customer remove the I.D. from the wallet.

Feel for

. Pin noise on the surface and look for color variations on the date of birth.

Examine:


- The photo and physical description. They should match the person handing you the ID.
- The excitation date. You CANNOT accept an excited ID.
- The birth cate. Are they old enough?
- · Whether-or-not the ID is a duplicate,
- The state logo, if it's partially missing or blurred, the ID might be fake.
- The hologram, is it a genuine hologram or a basic hologram added to a fake ID?
- The caro's reverse side lettering. Some ID makers neglect the back side of the ID. Look for blurred lettering or differences from the front of the ID.
- Whether it is an out-of-state acense. Use an ID Checking Guide when you're looking at an unfamiliar acense.




- About basic information on the card, such as the birth date, middle initial, zip code, age, etc.
- For a second form of ID. People with fake IDs rarely carry back-up identification.

Return:

- . If you are satisfied that the proof of age is valid, you may sell.
- If you are not convinced ireturn the ID to the customer and refuse the sale!








Determining Legal Date of Birth
