All beer applications must have a training policy submitted with application. This policy must include training regarding the sale of beer to minors.

19. Please read the following and upon signature of this application, you do understand and agree to comply if you are granted a permit.
- (a) You will not sell beer or similar beverages except at the place or places for which the beer board has issued your permit.
 - (b) You will not sell beer or any like beverage except in accordance with the terms of said permit.
 - (c) If this application is made for permit to sell and not for consumption on the premises, you will not sell for consumption on the premises and not allow consumption on the premises.
 - (d) You will rigidly enforce the law against sales to minors.
 - (e) You will prohibit gambling at your establishment and understand that the conduct of such activities on the premises will result in revocation of your permit.
 - (f) You will secure a certificate or statement from the health department or health officer that the premises covered by the application meet the requirements of the ordinances of the City of Franklin and the laws of the State of Tennessee.
 - (g) You will not attempt to transfer this permit to anyone else.
 - (h) You will display this permit in a prominent place in your establishment.
 - (i) You will not sell or distribute beer between the hours of 3:00 AM and 6:00 AM (8:00 AM for on premises consumption) during the week and between the hours of 3:00 AM Sunday and 12:00 Noon Sunday (10:00 AM for on premises consumption).
 - (j) You will prohibit the congregation at your establishment of those who reasonably appear to be intoxicated, lawless, rowdy, or prostitutes.
 - (k) You will not allow any liquor with alcoholic content of greater than five percent (5%) to be consumed on the premises.

- (l) You will not allow any sale or delivery of beer for consumption on the premises outside of the building, it being the intention to prohibit the sale of beer by what is commonly known as "curb service" or "curb sales" of beer.
- (m) You will comply with all requirements of section 2-201 through 2-229 of the municipal code of the City of Franklin.

A non-refundable \$250 fee must accompany this application and the application shall be submitted at least fifteen (15) days prior to the Beer Board meeting at which it is to be considered. If the application is approved you are required to provide documentation of sales tax registration to the city within ten days of approval. Any applicant making false statement in this application shall forfeit his permit and shall not be eligible to receive any permit for a period of ten years.

A privilege tax of \$100 is imposed on the business of selling, distributing, storing or manufacturing beer in this state effective January 1, 1994 and each successive January 1. Any holder of a beer permit issued after January 1, 1994 shall pay a pro rata portion of this annual tax when the permit is issued.

I hereby make application to the City of Franklin Beer Board for a beer permit.

The signing of this application acknowledges that I am aware of the laws prohibiting the sale of beer to minors.

I hereby certify that no person having at least a 5% ownership interest, nor any person to be employed in the distribution or sale of beer in my establishment has been convicted of any violation of the beer or alcoholic beverage laws or any crime involving moral turpitude within the past 10 years.

I am also aware that I shall not be issued a permit or my permit shall be revoked if my business location causes traffic congestion or interferes with schools, churches, or other public places of public gathering, or otherwise interferes with public health, safety and morals.







7-ELEVEN, INC. D/B/A TIGERMARKET #41067H ALCOHOL SERVICE POLICY

It is the policy of 7-ELEVEN, INC. (the "Company") that no minor (any person under the age of majority who is prohibited from being served alcoholic beverages under applicable law) or intoxicated person shall be served alcoholic beverages under any circumstances. Employees who willfully violate this policy will be terminated immediately. Any employee who negligently serves a minor or an intoxicated person will be counseled on proper service technique and will be terminated on the second violation of this policy.

Employees must request and review proper identification documentation (such as a valid state driver's license, passport or other form of identification issued by governmental authorities) for all persons ordering any alcoholic beverage. When attempting to illegally purchase alcohol, minors usually exhibit behavior that should be easily identifiable by a properly trained server or seller. As with anyone who is attempting a dishonest act, minors may appear anxious or nervous; stutter, stammer or confuse their words; avoid eye contact with the server or seller; appear overly or inappropriately friendly, confident, boisterous or outgoing.

When selling alcoholic beverages to the Company's customers, all employees shall take reasonable precautions to ensure that the person being served is legally permitted to purchase alcoholic beverages. Taking steps to prevent alcohol abuse in the Company's establishments can help protect the public from harm and keep you, as an employee, from being named in a liquor liability law suit.

As a seller of alcoholic beverages, the employee should know the laws and regulations concerning the serving and consumption of alcohol within licensed establishments. Selling alcoholic beverages to minors and/or to intoxicated persons is unlawful and may result in criminal penalties. Furthermore, if an intoxicated person, after leaving our establishment, should be involved in an accident, anyone who may be injured may file a lawsuit against you, the employee and/or the Company.

Follow some simple guidelines when serving alcohol and prevent this from happening to you or the Company. If someone enters the business and shows any sign of over-consumption of alcohol or remotely appears to be intoxicated, it is your job to make sure you do not sell alcoholic beverages to the individual. The following are some suggestions of alternative purchases if you suspect there is a possibility of intoxication of the customer:

- Offer or suggest the sale of protein food.
- Do not offer coffee or other caffeinated drink; this may cover the true extent of the patron's intoxication.
- Sell water or fruit juices.

Despite all your efforts, a customer may be intoxicated and should not be sold additional alcohol. If this occurs, every effort should be made to prevent the sale of alcoholic beverages without confrontation and embarrassment. Here are some suggestions to use when denying the sale of alcoholic beverages to a customer.

- Avoid a confrontation.
- Do not attempt any physical confrontation.
- Make the manager and all personnel aware of the problem.
- Suggest the sale of water and/or fruit juice
- Suggest an alternative form of transportation. If the patron insists on driving report this to your supervisor at once.

It is essential that a manager be aware of any potential situation where you believe there is a chance of an intoxicated customer or serving a minor. Remember, if a customer is intoxicated and is allowed to purchase alcoholic beverages and leaves the business and hurts someone, the authorities may likely hold you responsible along with the Company and management of the business. It is possible that you could be called to court and even be subject to criminal penalties. Always remember-there is no reason the sale of alcoholic beverages to an intoxicated customer should occur and absolutely no reason that a minor should be sold alcoholic beverages. Use “common sense” as well as what you have learned in your training with the Company, in your ABC Responsible Vendor Course and taking into consideration the above helpful hints.

If you follow these guidelines and act in a responsible manner, you are far less likely to be involved in any incident that may have an adverse effect on you, our customers and the Company.
