Alderman Petersen noted there will be a Professional Services Agreement with Barge Waggoner for another planning study. This study is about looking at the Riverfront between Pinkerton Park and Bicentennial Park. They are going to involve key stakeholders, and she asked that neighboring property owners be included as well.

Mr. Stuckey responded that they intend to involve property owners and others. This spins somewhat off the development proposal last year that requested an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance to allow for the construction of a hotel as a permitted use. The discussion around that request basically led to we weren't ready to make that change. We did want to look at how that area might interface with a Riverwalk or multiple use activities. That is folded together into this study. We will look at that over the next few months, and will include property owners, key stakeholders and the public. The study will provide more information to the board when considering such opportunities.
