Report of the Downtown Parking Review Team

February 13, 2018

Background and Scope of Review

- In Fall 2017, a staff team representing the following departments- City Court Clerk/Police/Law/IT- began meeting to document existing ordinances and recent practices relating to downtown parking enforcement.
- In December 2017, the group drafted a proposal to modernize ordinances related to parking enforcement with the goal of increasing the availability of customer parking in downtown Franklin while utilizing the existing staffing model (Monday-Friday), maintaining free parking in publicly owned and/or operated spaces and in accordance with current State of Tennessee law.
- In January 2018, the group was expanded to include Streets and Engineering Departments and to incorporate proposed changes to onsite parking time limitations and pavement markings.
