

## **ORDINANCE 2018-27**

### **TO BE ENTITLED: “AN ORDINANCE TO IMPLEMENT TIME RESTRICTED PARKING WITHIN THE CORE COMMERCIAL / RETAIL HISTORIC DOWNTOWN AREA.”**

**WHEREAS**, in August of 2016 the Board of Mayor and Aldermen approved a Professional services Agreement with Volkert, Inc. for the Downtown Parking Capacity and Management Study; and

**WHEREAS**, in January of 2018 the Board of Mayor and Aldermen acknowledged receipt of the final Downtown Parking Capacity and Management Study; and

**WHEREAS**, one recommendation within the study was to change the parking time limit from 4 hours to 2 hours within the core commercial / retail historic downtown area to help increase parking turnover and encourage long term parking in more appropriate locations; and

**WHEREAS**, City staff has developed multiple options, as shown in Exhibit A, based on input received from the Board of Mayor and Aldermen, public and parking stakeholder team involved throughout the Downtown Parking Capacity and Management Study.

### **NOW, THEREFORE:**

**SECTION I: BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Franklin, Tennessee, that the Board of Mayor and Aldermen has selected Option A, as shown in Exhibit A, identifying the locations and time restrictions associated with parking within the core commercial / retail historic downtown area. The parking time restrictions shall be strictly enforced Monday-Friday between 8AM-5PM, to include all holidays.

**SECTION II: BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Franklin, Tennessee, that the City Administrator shall be authorized to work with City staff to update and install the necessary signage / pavement markings within the downtown area to ensure these regulations are signed appropriately and remain enforceable.

**SECTION III: BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Franklin, Tennessee, that this Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage on second and final reading, and shall become enforceable when the required signage and pavement markings are installed.

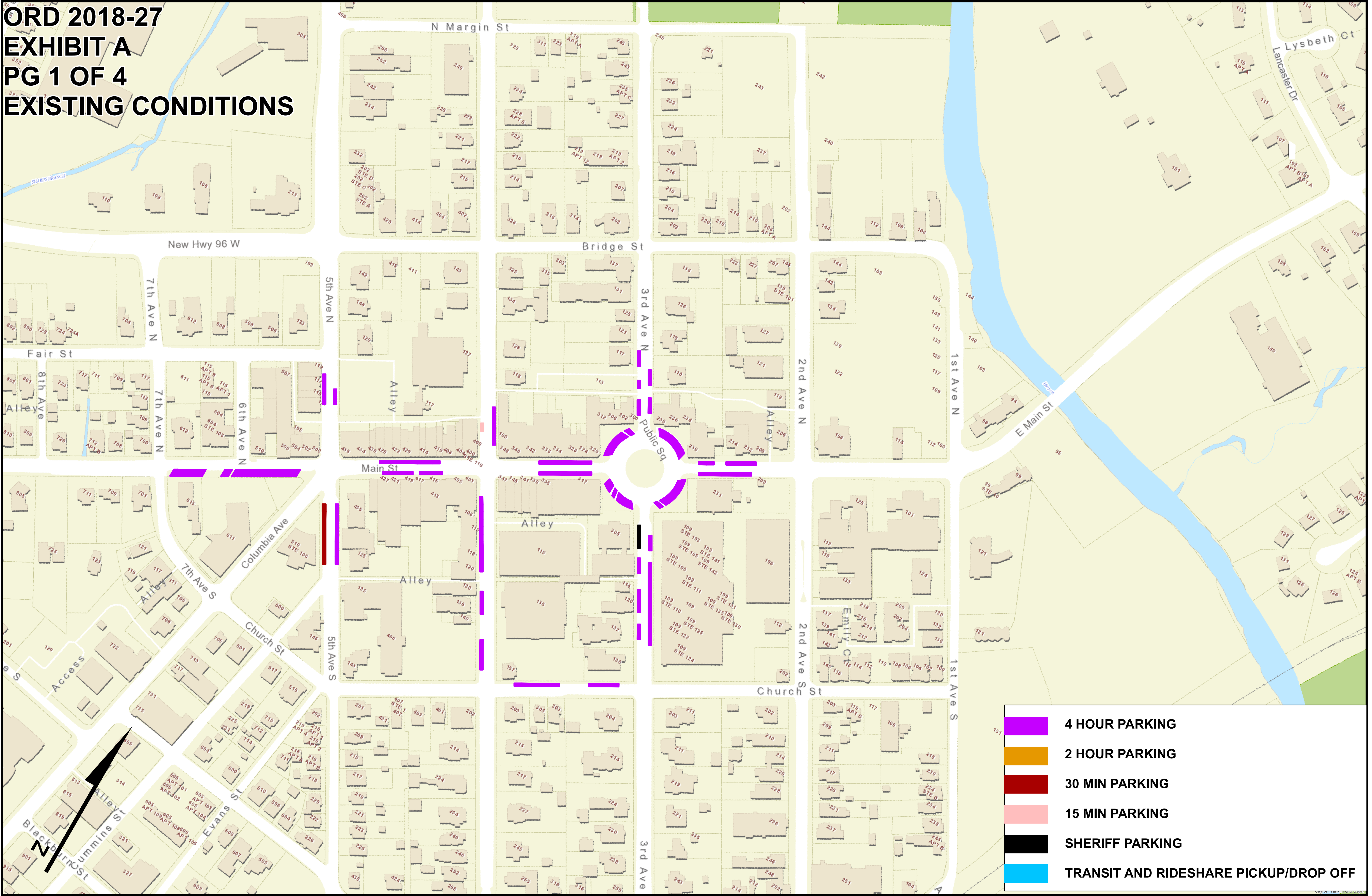

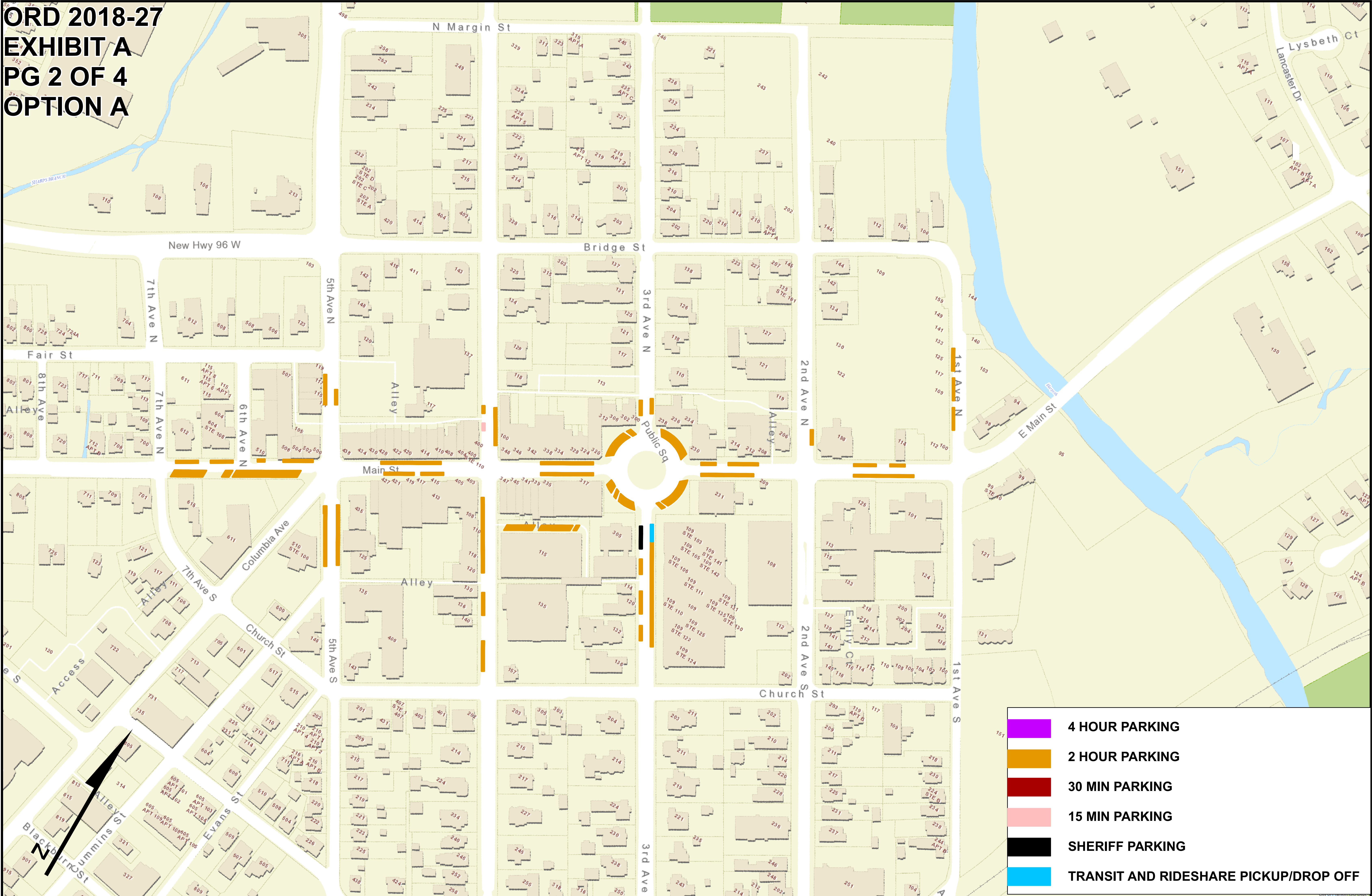


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EXHIBIT A  
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EXISTING CONDITIONS

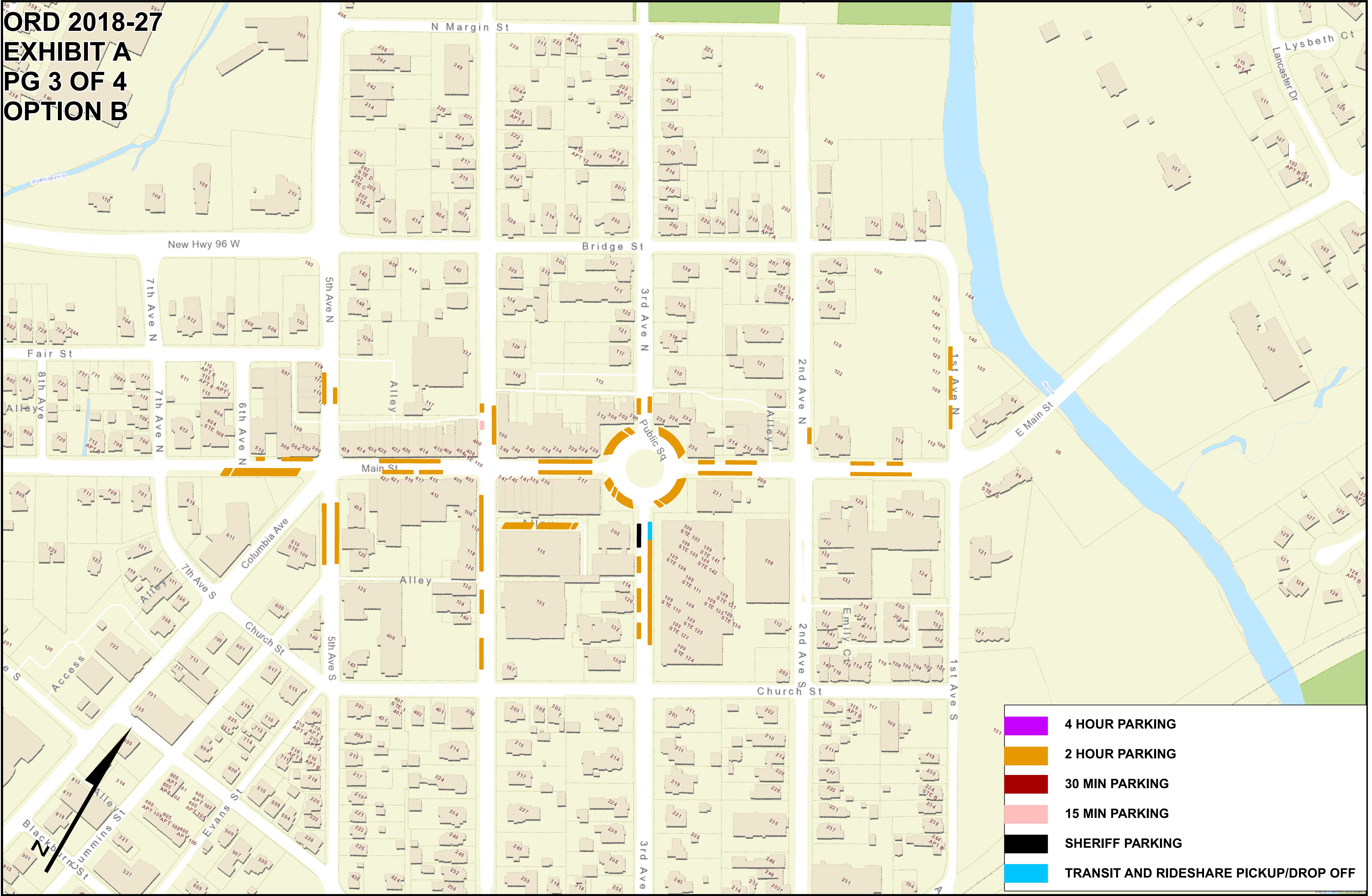
