CHAPTER 2. - PEDDLERS, SOLICITORS, ETC.

Sec. 9-201(2). - Definitions.

Itinerant merchant shall mean any person who is authorized to engage in the giving away, the selling or offering for sale, of goods, wares or merchandise, or who solicits patronage for any person, business, or service by word of mouth, or gesture, or by use of electrical, mechanical or sound-making devices, to entice or persuade anyone to buy, sell or accept goods, wares, or merchandise during the hours of 7.00 AM to 10.00 PM Sunday through Saturday within the corporate limits of the city, where the above-mentioned activities are conducted from a temporary or transient location with the express, written permission of the private property owner(s). For purposes of this section, "temporary or transient location" means from a stand, stall, kiosk, trailer, and/or vehicle that is intended to be temporary and removed from the property when not open for business (unless otherwise expressly permitted by the City). This section shall also apply to any and all ancillary equipment associated with the itinerant merchant, including, but not limited to, signs, tables, chairs, marketing materials, set-ups, and/or trash bins.

Sec. 9-208(2). - Limitations on use of streets and sidewalks.

(2) Prohibitions. The following activities shall be declared unlawful:

(a) Soliciting by parked vehicle or movable receptacle on public streets, highways, sidewalks, right-of-way, and public places.

(b) The erection of stands or similar contrivances on public streets, highways, sidewalks, rightsof-way, and public places for the purpose of giving away displaying and/or buying or selling of goods, wares or merchandise.

(c) Sale of drinks or other prepared foods and/or edible items upon public streets, sidewalks, highways and rights-of-way, except as may be regulated elsewhere in this Code.
