A RESOLUTION TO SELECT THE PEDESTRIAN AND/OR BICYCLE DESIGN CONCEPT FOR THE **COLUMBIA AVENUE WIDENING & IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT**

WHEREAS, on December 11, 2013, the Nashville Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) adopted the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for Fiscal Years 2014-2017, allocating \$6,000,000.00 in total funding to the Preliminary Engineering (Environmental), Design, and Right-of-Way phases of this project and reserves an additional \$15,000,000.00 in total funding for the Construction Phase; and

WHEREAS, the transportation improvements associated with the project will generally be funded with eighty percent (80%) federal funds and twenty percent (20%) state funds; and

WHEREAS, on July 14, 2015, the City of Franklin Board of Mayor and Aldermen unanimously approved the Local Agency Project Agreement (COF Contract No. 2014-0289, TDOT Contract No. 140204), which formally began the Columbia Avenue Widening & Improvements Project; and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2017, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen approved Resolution 2017-43, selecting the Five-Lane Concept (with Access Management) as the preferred design concept for the Columbia Avenue Widening & Improvements Project; and

WHEREAS, staff has continued to develop the Five-Lane Concept (with Access Management) with options for the accommodation of pedestrians and/or bicycles as shown on Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, TENNESSEE:

That the Board of Mayor and Aldermen select Option D, as shown in Exhibit A, as the preferred corridor design concept for pedestrian and/or bicycle accommodations for the Columbia Avenue Widening & Improvements Project.
