- 10 proposed (Stream Restoration, Culvert Repair, Bridge Replacement, Drainage Replacement)

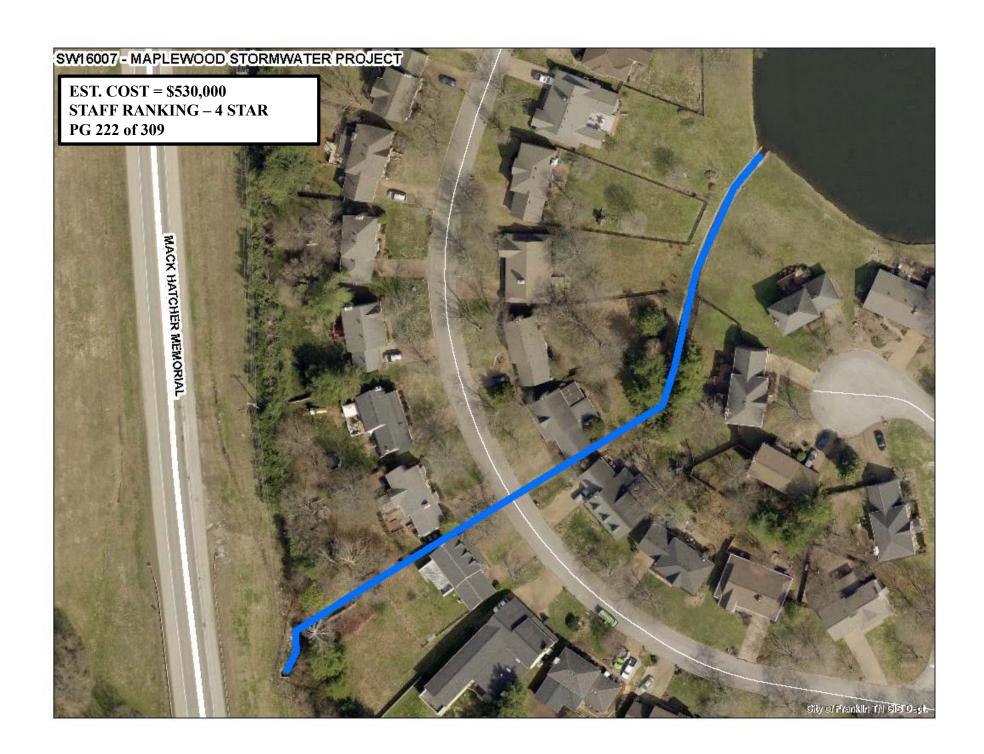

September 2018

November 2018

- Staff will present formal review of Financial Model & discuss available funding

December 2018/January 2019

- Staff will present BOMA consolidated prioritized rankings
- Board Approval of FY 2019-2028 CIP Projects

March 2019

- City will issue G.O. Bonds to partially fund CIP projects

May 2019

- City Administrator will present annual capital budget for FY 2020
