1. 18-0955 Discussion Regarding the 2019-2028 Capital Investment Program. Eric Stuckey, City Administrator

Financial Review

- <u>September 2016</u>: Estimated \$160 million in total available cash resources to support 10-year CIP; \$148 million Internal to City (Taxes, Fees) and \$12 million External to City (Grants, Developer Fees)
- September 2018: Basically the same; Estimate \$158 million in total available cash resources to support 10-year CIP; \$145 million Internal to City (Taxes, Fees) and \$13 million External to City (Grants)
- <u>Takeaway</u>: Even with expenditures on Capital Projects in the last two years, and servicing debt on the 2017 G.O. Bonds, tax collections and development fee fund balances are all significantly higher than two years ago.

Process Moving Forward

September 2018

- BOMA provides top 3 non-water/sewer projects to staff
- · BOMA provides additional projects not included in CIP book to staff

October 2018

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- Breakout meetings with BOMA
 - Transportation Parks Water/Sewer All Others
 - Four Consecutive weeks in October
- 1.5 2 Hours each
- · Staff Presentation & Summaries of 3-Star & 4-Star projects lasting no longer than first 30 minutes
- At end of breakout meetings, BOMA will be asked to submit prioritized rankings of all projects.

November 2018

- Staff will present BOMA consolidated prioritized rankings
- · Staff will present formal review of Financial Model & discuss available funding

December 2018/January 2019

Board Approval of FY 2019-2028 CIP Projects

March 2019

City will issue G.O. Bonds to Partially fund CIP projects

- May 2019
 - City Administrator will present annual capital budget for FY 2020

Comments:

- Completed projects cost approximately \$170 million with 85% in the transportation area and TDOT investment.
- East McEwen Phase 4: right-of-way significantly increased to \$35 and \$60 per square foot.
- Alderman Burger asked about Avalon Squared and needing ROW for turn lanes. Mr. Holzen replied that is not needed now.
- Southeast Municipal complex. Many moving parts to this project. Multi-use ballfields will be the first phase. Total cost of Southeast property is \$31.2 million with the potential for a water reclamation plant at that location.

- Alderman McLendon wanted to clarify that the water reclamation plant would be an additional facility and not a replacement for the current facility, and that all the numbers being discussed today are high level estimates and are placeholder numbers. They could go up or down. Not to be compared to construction costs.
- Mr. Stuckey added that an additional water reclamation plant in the Southeast has not been approved. It would be a future decision.
- Concerning Lockwood Glen, with the dam mitigation process it is hard to know the costs and what improvements will be needed.
- Vice Mayor Martin asked about the sidewalk gap on Lewisburg Avenue and was told that it would cost over \$1 million and wouldn't qualify for the lower-cost sidewalk gap projects. The fix for the Lewisburg Avenue sidewalk involves the road and what is underneath as well as drainage.
- Fire Station 7 bid is expected in the next month or so.
- The Franklin Road bridge replacement will have to be coordinated with TDOT: culvert vs. longer bridge.
- Discussed the Mallory Lane/Royal Oaks/Liberty Pike intersection regarding bicycles and pedestrians, roundabouts vs. traffic lights (too many). Alderman Speedy pointed out there will be many 16 and 17-year-old drivers going through that intersection since Centennial High is there.
- · Local high-volume traffic streets are up for resurfacing this year.
- The Aldermen were asked to turn in their top three projects by the October 25 BOMA meeting, and they were given specific instructions.
- · Questions were asked and answered about ranking and projects.
- · CIP meetings will be scheduled for each Monday in October.
