With no one coming forward to speak, Mayor Moore declared the Public Hearing closed

Alderman Petersen moved to approve Ordinance 2018-47. Seconded by Alderman McLendon. Motion carried unanimously 7-0 on Second of Three Readings.

NEW BUSINESS

6. 18-0965 Consideration of Amendment A to Interlocal Agreement between the City of Franklin and Williamson County, Tennessee, for Redistribution of Local Sales Taxes (COF Contract 2017-0145)

Eric Stuckey, City Administrator Shauna Billingsley, City Attorney Kristine Tallent, ACA/CFO Alderman Blanton moved to approve Amendment 1 to COF Contract 2017-0145. Seconded by Alderman Petersen.

Discussion:

- Eric Stuckey noted that Williamson County's attorney had not yet commented on the amendment to share some of the proceeds from the extra tax with Franklin Special School District.
- Alderman Barnhill said it annoying to give FSSD \$3.5 million that we don't yet have.
 The City has millions of dollars' worth of capital improvements to be done. He has never seen this type of agreement with a six-month extension. He will not support the amendment.
- Alderman Burger heard from constituents that it was not apparent how to share the money. The people that she heard from don't like the idea and she will not support the amendment.
- Alderman McLendon doesn't think the Aldermen should give away sales tax for something that should be settled between the two school districts. Won't support.
- Vice Mayor Martin said she didn't look at it that way. These are our children; half of them go to Williamson County Schools after 8th grade in FSSD schools. The good education children get here is what brings people to Franklin. If we can't do a little bit to help then it's sad. She will support this.
- Alderman Petersen: Clarification The part of sales tax to schools is being divided in the normal way. It is the part that the City added that is in question, 8% to FSSD and the rest to the County schools. FSSD assumed part would be theirs and the County thought it was all theirs. Would the extra half-year give Williamson County Schools the amount they were expecting?
- Mr. Stuckey said it probably gives the County a little more than they would have received in three years. Both would be receiving money during the extra sixmonths.
- Alderman McLendon: Both entities can raise their taxes. We are being asked to forgo money to buy peace between two other taxing entities.
- Alderman Speedy noted that campaign materials stated that both school districts would benefit.

Motion to approve Amendment 1 to COF Contract 2017-0145 **Failed 3-4**, with Aldermen Blanton, Petersen and Vice Mayor Martin voting in favor, and Aldermen Barnhill, Burger, McLendon and Speedy voting against.
