## 6. 18-1101 ★Consideration of RESOLUTION 2018-97, A Resolution to Clarify COF Contract No. 2017-0145 with Franklin Special School District (FSSD) and Williamson County Relative to the Additional One-Half Percent Sales Tax.

## Alderman Dana McLendon

Alderman McLendon moved to approve Resolution 2018-97. Seconded by Alderman Blanton.

Alderman McLendon explained that when the Board was asked by the County to defer the Sales Tax increase for funding schools, he thought all the sales tax being deferred under that agreement would be divided, as is all school tax, between Williamson County Schools and FSSD as all the sales taxes are. It was pitched that way to the Community. However, County Mayor Anderson didn't say that in his presentation nor did the topic come up at all. The resolution failed at the last meeting because it would have deferred \$3.5-\$4 million of City revenues to FSSD, while the County would have kept all the money that came in for three years. Alderman McLendon was clear he wanted this to sunset in three years and wants the FSSD to get their share. This Resolution is to express the intent, that all the sales tax money will be divided between the county and FSSD. We can't enforce that, but we can express our intent then allow the other parties do what they think they ought to do.

Motion to approve Resolution 2018-97 carried unanimously.
