RESOLUTION 2018-97

A RESOLUTION TO CLARIFY INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH WILLIAMSON COUNTY (COF CONTRACT N. 2017-0145) RELATIVE TO THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE HALF OF THE ONE-HALF PERCENT SALES TAX INCREASE ALLOCATED FOR SCHOOLS

WHEREAS, in 2017, the City agreed to support a referendum that would raise local sales tax by one-half percent (0.5%) with the understanding that for three (3) years the City's portion of the revenue from the increased sales tax would go to the schools to be used for rural and general school debt purposes; and

WHEREAS, the voters of Williamson County approved the referendum to establish the additional one-half percent (0.5%) local option sales in February of 2018 resulting in the additional sales tax going into effect on April 1, 2018; and

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the City that Franklin Special School District (FSSD) has not been receiving revenue from the City's portion of the additional one-half percent (0.5%) local option sales tax since the referendum was passed; and

WHEREAS, to clarify the issue between FSSD and Williamson County, the City offered an Amendment to the 2017 Interlocal Agreement (COF Contract No. 2017-0145) to make it clear the intent of the City was to include FSSD; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Mayor and Aldermen do wish to clarify its intent of the 2017 Interlocal Agreement (COF Contract No. 2017-0145) making certain it is clear that FSSD was, along with Williamson County, an intended recipient of the one-half percentage (0.5%) increase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, TENNESSEE, AS FOLLOWS:

It was and is the City of Franklin's intent to include FSSD in redistribution of the one-half percent (0.5%) sales tax increase including the City of Franklin's portion of the local sales tax using the Average Daily Attendance to determine the amount due to FSSD and to Williamson County.
