City of Franklin Current Regulations

Motorized vehicles are not allowed on sidewalks

Segways can be on sidewalks if it is a guided tour

Helmets are not required

Scooters & Other Cities

Memphis

Brentwood

Nashville

- Use Bolt & Spin
- Discourage scooters on sidewalks
- Helmets are encouraged but not required

- Do not allow scooters
- There is not a suitable location for this transportation option
- Reduced number of scooters
- Helmets are not required

Scooters & Other Cities

Knoxville

- Strict RFP
- Not allowed on sidewalks
- Have a set district
- Do not operate during football games
- Helmets are recommended but not required

Asheville, NC

Open City Hall
 Survey found 91% of respondents did not want e-scooters



Safety

Most accidents were head injuries caused by motor vehicles collisions when the scooterist was not wearing a helmet.

Reliable infrastructure is essential for safety-bike lanes and multi-use trails are ideal for scooters.


When not in use, scooters can be designated to specific areas to control littering.

- Option 2: Scooter Districts
- Option 3: Let Scooters Reign



Scooter District Pilot Program

- Vendors will submit a RFP via purchasing department
- Would not be in Downtown Franklin
- Violations would be handled by the scooter company
- Scooters can ride on local streets, bike lanes, and multi-use trails
