The Planning and Sustainability Department will strive to protect and enhance the built and natural environment by providing a comprehensive vision for future growth, protection of historic and natural resources, and excellent planning services for businesses and residents of Franklin.

- Works with the Planning Commission to identify and complete long range planning initiatives.
- Processes annexation requests and current development applications in order to continue quality growth.
- Provides assistance to Historic Zoning Commission, the Franklin Civil War Historical Commission, the Board of Zoning Appeals, the Sustainability Commission, and several other entities.



FY20 Accomplishments

- Adoption of the Zoning Ordinance (web-friendly and interactive), Zoning Map, and Subdivision Regulations.
- Promoted 3 planners internally and hired 3 new planners.
- Review of approximately 200 land development applications.
- Completion of the National Register Nomination Update for Hincheyville.
- Completion of a Developments Map and Historic Property Address Map.
- Creation of online submittal and review applications for Annexations and Certificates of Appropriateness.
- Adoption of increased Planning review fees, including a new annexation review fee.
- Annexation of 26 properties, located outside of the UGB, by referendum.
- Held Planapalooza as public outreach for the Zoning Update.
- Hosted the TN Planning Association Conference in Franklin.




FY21 Goals

FY 2020: \$228,488

FY 2021: \$212,108

Change: -16,380 (or -7.2%)

- Decrease a result of one-time consulting services for Zoning Ordinance not needed in FY 2021.
- Needed computer upgrades for all staff in the department.
- -Continued emphasis on continuing professional education in order to develop urban design skills and observe best planning practices for the City staff and officials.
