**SUBJECT:** Consideration of Ordinance 2019-31: An Ordinance to Prohibit On-Street Parking Along Both Sides of the Entire Length of Benelli Park Court. (WS 10/8/19; BOMA 11/12/19, 8-0) SECOND AND FINAL READING

### Purpose

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide information to the Franklin Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BOMA) concerning Ordinance 2019-31.

### Background

Residents of the Benelli Park subdivision, located off Boyd Mill Avenue, contacted the City to express their concern with motorists parking along the short and narrow (e.g. 22 feet wide) residential street of Benelli Park Court. The residents along this street request the installation of "No Parking" signs along both sides of the street. Staff instructed the residents to conduct a petition to obtain a decision from a majority of the property

owners along Benelli Park Court. Of the nine (9) properties located on Benelli Park Court, seven (7) signed the petition to establish “No Parking” zones on both sides of Benelli Park Court. This represents 78% of the affected property owners who are in favor of “No Parking”.

**Financial Impact**

The cost associated with the implementation of this ordinance is minimal and includes materials (*i.e.* signs and posts) and staff labor for installation.

**Recommendation**

Staff recommends approval of Ordinance 2019-31.
